I has been a blessing reading through the book of Acts during this past month. Acts chronicles the accounts of the early church immediately following Jesus' ascension back to Heaven. Upon hearing these words, King Agrippa, Felix the Governor and the other high officials delivered Paul as a prisoner from Jerusalem into the hands of the Romans.

What I have been reminded of while readying through the book of Acts is that we serve the same God, commit allegiance to the same saviour and have the same Holy Spirit living inside of us giving us power to proclaim the Gospel. The message of the Gospel will excite similar responses as it did 2000 years ago, however; it's a message of Good News that everyone needs to hear. May we be faithful in both living and sharing the Gospel. I am thankful for every opportunity we have to be messengers here at CCA!

For "everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved." How then will they call on Him in whom they have not believed? And how are they to believe in Him of whom they have never heard? And how are they to hear without someone preaching? Romans 10:13-14




# Open House
