

# A GLANCE AHEAD! May 2019

hen Jesus was crucified on the cross alone, in between two criminals, it looked like it was game over and all hope was lost. All those who knew Jesus and had followed Him watched at a distance. The religious leaders of the day had their way as they yelled in unison "crucify him, crucify him!" (Luke 23:21). Rome had once again won as Pilate sentenced that their demand be met. Judas betrayed Jesus, Peter denied Jesus, there are broken hearted and scared disciples and people who love Jesus. But thankfully the story doesn't end there...

As you read the last chapters of the Gospels and into the book of Acts, you see the stone was rolled away as Jesus was raised from the dead, a victor over death. Jesus had declared while alive that he had the power to lay down his life and take it up again (John 10:18) and that He was the Resurrection and the Life (John 11:25).


After Jesus was raised from the dead, for 40 days he showed himself alive by many infallible proofs (Acts 1:3). The Gospels record that He met them at the tomb, on the mountain, on the road to Emmaus, and ate breakfast on the beach with His disciples. The Apostle Paul says he appeared to more than 500 brethren at the same time (1 Cor 15:6).

As a result of seeing Jesus alive, these once-scared and heartbroken followers of Jesus courageously made their way to the streets of Jerusalem, risking their lives, and boldly proclaimed the good news of the Gospel, the good news that Jesus is alive! Peter stood up in the midst of the people and declared "Men of Israel, listen to these words....God has raised Him up again" (Acts 2:14-36). And again the second time Peter declared "But you disowned the Holy and Righteous One and asked for a murderer to be granted to you, but put to death the Prince of life, the one whom God raised from the dead, a fact to which we are witnesses" (Acts 3:14-15)

The unrelenting faith of the disciples is further evidence that Jesus is alive!
