ome may know the line "more than words" from a popular love song that came out years ago. In the song, the songwriter tells the listener that love is an action and must be shown with "more than words." The song continues to say that the words, I love you, would not be necessary when love is an action because "I'd already know."

In February, we often think of the theme of love. It's not uncommon to see hearts displayed in the windows of stores with candies, chocolates, and valentines. I appreciate a holiday dedicated to the theme of love, but I wonder how many people pause to think about where love comes from. While appreciated, the dollar store chocolates and cardboard valentines don't capture a deep heartfelt love, in my opinion.

So, where does love come from? Though love is often represented by a heart, we know that the brain regulates the feeling of love. Our beautiful brains are built in unexplainable ways to feel, detect, sense, experience, and express love in what philosophers from the ancient Greeks have traditionally distinguished three notions that can properly be called "love": eros, agape, and philia. These three expressions of love distinguish between friendly, romantic, and unconditional love. In Genesis 1:26, we read that God made humans in HIS image, after HIS likeness. Meaning when God made us, He hardwired the love into us. When we experience or express love, we display that we are made in His image. He is the author of love. He is love.

- God's love is personal (John 3:16)
- God loves you (1 John 4:9-10)
- God's love transforms (1 John 4:7)
- God's love inspires you to love others (1 John 3:11)
- God's love compelled Him to die for you (1 John 3:16)
- There is no fear in God's love. His perfect love casts out fear (1 John 4:18)
- We love God because He first loved us (1 John 4:19)

I don't know if the author of the "More than Words" song knew the Bible verse 1 John 3:18, but he captured the concept found in scripture that teaches not to love only in word or talk but in deed and in truth! More. Than. Words. God's love is more than words. His actions showed unconditional love when he came to earth and willingly died for us because of His love.

If you have never had the chance to read God's love letter, the Bible, maybe by His actions, you, like the artist, will be able to say, "I already knew that your love for me was real." ~Sylvia Bourne

Community - Canada Dental Benefit

The interim Canada Dental Benefit is intended to help lower dental costs for eligible families earning less than \$90,000 per year. Parents and guardians can apply if the child receiving dental care is under 12 years old and does not have access to a private dental insurance plan. Depending on your adjusted family net income, a tax-free payment of \$260, \$390, or \$650 is available for each eligible child.

Applications are now open. Applicants must have filed the previous year's tax return and be in receipt of the Canada Child Benefit for each eligible child in their care.

Dental/Vison Screening for JK/SK/Grade 2

Public Health has offered CCA the opportunity to participate in a Dental and Vision screening program for JK/SK and Grade 2 students. Our school opted to participate in the program screening on February 15, 2023.

All JK/SK and Grade 2 students will participate unless they opt-out.

To opt out, parents must notify the Health Unit at 1-800-660-5853 AND we ask that you also let the CCA office know if you are opting out.

There will be three non-invasive tests which will take roughly 15 minutes per child. All children screened will receive a letter with the screening results to bring home.

February 10 and 24 are Dress Down days for all students that bring a food bank donation.




Gratitude Gala
