A t this time of year, the spring grass is starting to sprout through the dead yellow grass left behind from the fall. Lawns are beginning to look green instead of brown, and the earth is doing what it does in spring "Tender grass springs out of the earth" (Samuel 23:4). It only takes a week or two before the lawn is ready for its first cut. Seeing the fresh green grass reminds me that sometimes when I look at other people's lives, I think the grass looks greener over there. This idiom refers to the thoughts we have when looking at someone's situation, and it seems better than our own, or things we don't have, seem better than what we do have. It's easy enough to fall into that way of thinking if we forget all of our blessings in Christ. Today I want to share a perspective for each of us to think about when we find ourselves longing for what others appear to have. As a Christian (Christ-Follower), the Scriptures tell us we have many spiritual blessings. In just one chapter of the Bible (Ephesians Chapter 1), we are told that;

We are chosen

We are Holy and blameless (because Jesus paid our sin debt)

We are loved

We are adopted into God's family

We are accepted

We are redeemed (Christ our redeemer)

We are forgiven if we acknowledge our wrongs (sins)

We are beneficiaries of God's grace (thank you, God)

We are known

We have eternal life

We have the truth from His Spirit in us

We have a guarantee (deposit) that Christ will come back for us

We have hope (need this daily)

We are rich (different currency than this old world - a different economy!)

We have power (the same power as the men and women in the Bible had)


