If your child wishes to ride the bus home with a friend, please use a One-Time Bus Use Form to communicate this in advance, available from the office.

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
# CCA Christmas Concert – Important Update

#### Homework Expectations

By now, students have settled into their classes and are becoming aware of grade-level expectations. As students progress through grades at CCA, excellence in all areas is expected. We ask for your support in enforcing homework and academic excellence. As the Parent Handbook explains, as a general rule, students should expect 10 minutes of homework per grade level. In grade two, that is 20 minutes. In grade six, sixty minutes, and so on. This has been the expectation for many years. Our philosophy is that this expectation sets CCA apart from other schools by asking families to be involved and partner with us in their children's education. Studies show that parental involvement with homework and engagement in their child's education is related to higher academic performance, better social skills and behavior, and increased self-confidence.

From our own experience, observations, and alumni testimony, this expectation benefits students and gradually prepares students for academic pursuits outside of elementary school. An email was circulated in October sharing the perspective the Academy has on homework.

#### Resource

The Resource Program provides students with the opportunity for occasional help that is course-specific or general help with assignments. The resource program provides an opportunity for students to get more one on one help than possible in a classroom setting. When you sign up for a "block" of resource it will be either one on one, once a week, or twice a week in a small group ranging from 2-4 students.

There are 2 ways to have your child enrolled in the Resource Program;

 Based on a recommendation from an external source such as a professional assessment and in communication with Mr. Bourne and Mrs. Connor.
Preference or need identified by staff or parents and communicated through Mr. Bourne and Mrs. Connor.

Families can sign up and pay for the program with their tuition payments or make one time payments as needs arise and students are added to the program.

The resource staff will also be assisting in special circumstances as deemed necessary by the teacher, such as a student who may need help or more attention with a particular assignment, supervision for a missed test or a student who has completed all their work and has moved on to something more challenging. We hope to create and foster a resource environment that is welcoming, friendly and accessible by children of all capacities. If you are interested in the remaining spots in our program please contact the office and we can begin the process.
