I confess, when I think about Christmas, my mind immediately goes to tangible things like decorations, gifts, events, food, time with family and friends, Christmas music and movies, and, of course, a Christmas service at school or church. All great things. All great people. All great. But I'm guilty of forgetting to stop and take a sacred pause to think about how all of this began. There were no bells jingling, no sleighs riding, and contrary to the popular song, the beginning of what we call *Christmas* was not a silent night. Andrew Peterson captures this beautifully in his song *"It Was Not a Silent Night."*

"It was not a silent night, there was blood on the ground. You could hear a woman cry, in the alleyway that night, on the streets of David's town. And the stable was not clean. And the cobblestones were cold. And little Mary full of grace, with the tears upon her face, had no mother's hand to hold. It was a labor of pain, it was a cold sky above. But for the girl on the ground in the dark, with every beat of her beautiful heart, it was a labor of love. Noble Joseph by her side, calloused hands and weary eyes. There were no midwives to be found, on the streets of David's town, in the middle of the night. So he held her and he prayed. Shafts of moonlight on his face. But the baby in her womb, He was the maker of the moon, He was the Author of the faith, that could make the mountains move. For little Mary full of grace, with the tears upon her face, it was a labor of love."

The Spirit of Christmas existed long before we celebrated it by giving gifts. Christmas is God's Spirit revealed - He gave His Son to us. It was an ancient plan that God foretold in the Holy Scriptures long before Mary was even alive. I've been told that we give gifts today because the wise men gave gifts to Jesus. But I think it makes even more sense that we give gifts because we recognize that God first gave us the greatest gift, Jesus, and He created us in His image to be gift-givers. We *love* to give gifts! Just wait until you see your child or "little shopper" watching you open the gift they picked out at the CCA sale. Their face will light up with joy as a giver.

I know, we can't always afford to give a tangible gift. Remember that sometimes the most meaningful gifts are less material: our time, our presence, our words, a listening ear, helping hands, a thoughtful text, a handwritten card, homemade baked goods, or something we already own and want to bless someone with. There may not be a price tag on these gifts, but the impact is just as real because they are given as a *labor of love*. John 15:13 reminds us, "Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends."

This Christmas season, I encourage you to take a sacred pause from the busyness. Thank God for His perfect gift. And then take time to consider how you can lay down your life in love—by giving something, doing something, or saying something that doesn't require pulling out a credit card. Gift someone with something less tangible, more intentional—a true labor of love.

### **Governance Board vs. Working Board — What's the Difference?**

Have you ever wondered how a governance structure differs from a working structure? Here is a helpful overview:

#### **Working Board**

A working board is actively involved in the day-to-day operations of an organization in addition to carrying out strategic and fiduciary responsibilities. These boards are most common in small organizations, startups, and community groups that may lack the resources to hire paid staff.

#### **Governance Board**

A governance board provides strategic guidance and oversight at the highest level of an organization. Rather than running day-to-day operations, a governance board ensures the long-term health, direction, and accountability of the institution.

#### **Key responsibilities of a governance board include:**

- Governance and organizational oversight
- Strategic planning and long-term direction
- Risk management and policy oversight
- Hiring and evaluating leadership
- Legal and regulatory compliance
- Advocacy and representation
- Supervising one employee — the Executive Director or CEO (for CCA, the Principal/CEO)

A Board Charter or set of Bylaws clearly outlines these responsibilities and defines the scope, authority, and expectations of the Board, supporting transparency and ethical governance.

#### **CCA's Governance Model**

When CCA began in 1997, the Board of Directors functioned as a working board, filling both operational and governance roles. As the school has grown, so has the leadership structure. Today, CCA operates under a Governance Board model. The Principal/CEO is directly accountable to the Board, while the Principal/CEO provides leadership and oversight to the Academy's staff team of 35. Each year, the Board participates in an external financial audit, and the Board Treasurer provides an annual financial update at the AGM. We are grateful for the dedication, prayer, and leadership of our Board as they help guide CCA with wisdom, integrity, and a long-term vision for flourishing Christian education.
